

# CLGA SENIOR AMATEUR 2024 - PLAYER INFORMATION

## 1. Score Card Information

Players will tee off from the Hybrid (White/Gold) tees on the Lakes/Slopes rotation. The course rating is 71.2, slope rating is 131 and it is a par 71; total yards of 5432.

## 2. Registration

Registration will start at **7AM on Tuesday, August 13**. Please arrive at the registration table at least 30 minutes in advance of your tee time. Registration will be located in the simulator room in the clubhouse.

## 3. Tournament Details

- Tee times will commence at 8:00 a.m. on hole #1 on the Lakes and hole #10 on the Slopes. Players must arrive at their respective tee box 10 minutes prior to their tee time.
- Play will be from the CLGA Tee Markers.
- Flights will be determined by indexes. Indexes/handicaps were frozen at midnight on July 31, 2024.

## 4. Notes to Competitors

- Pull carts are complimentary and power carts are available at \$34 single rider or \$22.50 shared per person: limit 2 carts per group. These are purchased in the Golf Shop.
- Overnight club storage will NOT be available.
- The driving range will open at **6:30am** each morning.
- Participant pin sheets, meal vouchers, and caddy bibs will be available at the registration desk at sign-in. Scorecards will be given out on the first tee.
- Cell phones must be put on silent or vibrate. Refrain from using cell phones except in an emergency or to call for a Rules Official.
- Rules officials will be available on the course both days.
- Immediately following your round proceed directly to the scoring table in the simulator room. Your scorecards will be vetted and will require sign-off by the participant at that time.

## 5. Tee Time Postings

Tee times for the first round on Tuesday, August 13 will be posted on the Golf Genius ID **GDCNQL** after completion of the draw on **Monday, August 5**. Tee times for the final round on Wednesday, August 14 will be posted on the Golf Genius after completion of play on Tuesday, August 13.

## 6. Caddies

Caddies, whether present for both days or just one of the days, must be registered on the first day of competition at the registration table. Caddy bibs can be signed out at that time by the competitor. Please be sure to return caddy bibs to the scoring table and confirm their name is checked off as being returned. Competitors will be charged for bibs not returned. Caddies will be required to wear running shoes or golf shoes on the golf course.

Caddies may purchase snacks and lunches at the Snack Bar or Bistro 45. On Tuesday caddies will be able to have lunch in the Westmoor Lounge with competitors and they will be able to order off the menu and make payment to their server. Caddy lunch tickets for Wednesday - \$70 /pp have to be purchased 5 days ahead of time and must be paid for before a caddy bib is signed out. ## 7. Hospitality and Meals

Complimentary lunch will be available for all competitors after completion of rounds on Tuesday. Refreshments and snacks are available for purchase at the Snack Bar or Bistro 45. You are encouraged to bring a reusable water bottle as filtered water is available at several locations on course as well as at Bistro 45. Lunch will be served on Wednesday in the Banquet room following the completion of play. Trophies and awards will be presented after all groups are finished their rounds.

## 8. Safety on the Course

If a weather issue requires a suspension in play, shelters are located on #2, #9, #12 and #15.

## 9. Spectators

Spectators are requested to stay off the fairways and greens at all times and will remain at least 30 feet from all competitors. Spectators are expected to be quiet during play.

## 10. Spotters

There are no Spotters on the course. Proceed accordingly under the R&A/USGA/Golf Canada Rules of Golf.

## 11. Tournament Awards

### Overall winners:

## 12. Breaking Ties

In the event of a tie for the Calgary Senior Ladies Amateur Champion, a sudden death playoff will take place beginning on Slopes #9 playing it a maximum of 3 times to determine a winner. If still tied, players will move to Lakes #1 to determine a winner. All other flight ties will be broken using the USGA Scorecard Retrogression Method from last 9,6,3,1 holes.

## 13. Close of Competition

The competition is deemed to have been closed when the trophy has been presented to the winner, or in the absence of a prize ceremony, when the Committee has approved all scores.

## 14. Awards Banquet

The Awards Banquet will be held Wednesday in the Banquet room following the completion of play. Trophies and awards will be presented after all groups are finished their rounds. **Any caddies or guests wanting to attend the banquet must order tickets and must include payment of \$70 / pp a minimum of 5 days prior.** Contact Daniel Law at [dlaw@glencoe.org](mailto:dlaw@glencoe.org) for payment.

## 15. Local Rules and Regulations

- If a ball lies off the putting green and on the closely mown portion but not in a hazard and if an immovable obstruction within two club lengths of the putting green and within two club lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows: the ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay that (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids intervention (c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green and (d) is on turf cut to similar height.. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.
- All flower beds and rock gardens are ground under repair. Relief must be taken.
- Wood chips and mulch are loose impediments.
- Relief is permitted from all wooden paths through bunkers. Take the nearest point of relief no closer to the hole and drop within one club length. The ball must be dropped in the bunker.
